Board of Directors Job Description

Election to the Board of Directors is an honor with attendant and fiduciary responsibilities. It calls upon the person elected for a dedication of time, thought, energy, and financial support towards the viability and support of arts education and Friends of Sacramento Arts.

Board Term of Office:

One three-year term with an option for a second three-year term at the discretion of the Governance and Executive Committee of the Board.

General Responsibilities:

- Assist the board in carrying out its fiduciary responsibilities, including but not limited to preparing Annual Budgets, reviewing the Friends of Sacramento Arts' annual financial statements, and protecting the organization's assets.
- Recognize that an essential function of a good board is fundraising and to cooperate fully in achieving the Friends of Sacramento Arts' financial goals by making their own gift and by participating in annual fundraising efforts, according to their ability. Recommended individual annual commitment is \$750-\$1,000.
- Be an ambassador and proponent of the arts and the Friends of Sacramento Arts to the general public and work to engage the people of our community in arts education and the work of Friends of Sacramento Arts.
- Serve on at least one committee and attend the monthly board meetings
- Keep up to date on developments in the Friends of Sacramento Arts' field of arts education.
- Follow conflict of interest and confidentiality policies

Time Commitment:

- The board of directors and the committees meet 10 times annually. Monthly estimated commitment is 3-4 hours per month which includes attending one committee meeting, one board meeting and individual work in preparing for meetings, attending events and assisting with fundraising.
